Intrauterine devices (IUDs) – usually used as a primary contraceptive method – are sometimes used as the most effective form of emergency contraception. However, the use of IUDs for emergency contraception is relatively rare. 1a20d74409

Endometrial ablation This procedure can cause patients to experience permanent side effects and long-term complications. There are very limited surgical treatments to address abnormal uterine bleeding, the only other option being hysterectomy. This destruction causes the formation of scar tissue, preventing the endometrium from regrowing. is not as effective as the IUD, with blood reduction rates ranging from 35 to 69%. It is estimated that around 500,000 patients undergo endometrial ablation procedures each year. Endometrial ablation is typically used to address abnormal uterine bleeding, which can be a symptom of multiple health conditions. If birth control is stopped or the IUD is removed, abnormal bleeding Endometrial ablation is a minimally invasive gynecological surgical procedure that ablates or destroys the endometrium, or lining, of the uterus. The decrease in regrowth is intended to reduce the amount of bleeding. Endometrial ablation does not cure any medical conditions, it is used to reduce symptoms that conditions cause. In addition, suppression of hormonal cyclicity may benefit menstrual-related mood swings or other conditions which increase in frequency with menses. Management of menstruation may be a challenge for those with developmental delay or intellectual disability, and menstrual suppression can benefit individuals with specific job- or activity-related needs. There is increasing attention being given to menstrual suppression for transgender men and non-binary transmasculine people who may experience dysphoria with menstruation. Menstrual suppression is also being used by individuals with a variety of personal reasons to have less frequent or no menses, including honeymoon, vacations, travel, or other specific reasons. 1a20d74409

Menstrual disorder There are many different types of menstrual disorders that vary with signs and symptoms, including pain during menstruation, heavy bleeding, or absence of menstruation. Primary dysmenorrhea is when there is no underlying cause that is identified A menstrual disorder is any abnormal condition related to a woman's period. Normal variations can occur in menstrual patterns but generally menstrual disorders can also include periods that come sooner than 21 days apart, more than 3 months apart, or last more than 10 days in duration. pelvic scarring due to chlamydia or gonorrhea, and intrauterine devices or IUDs. Variations of the menstrual cycle are mainly caused by the immaturity of the hypothalamic-pituitary-ovarian (HPO) axis, and early detection and management is required in order to minimize the possibility of complications regarding future reproductive ability 1a20d74409

Intrauterine device As a form of long-acting reversible contraception (LARC), IUDs last for many years depending on the exact product. The intrauterine device (IUD), also known as an intrauterine contraceptive device (IUCD or ICD), is a small, T-shaped birth control device that is inserted into the uterus to prevent pregnancy 1a20d74409

In the 1920s, cervical caps (and also diaphragms) were often just called pessaries. 1a20d74409 IUDs are a safe and effective birth control method that can be divided into two major categories based on the mechanism the device uses to prevent pregnancy: hormonal (levonorgestrel) IUDs and copper IUDs. Both types of IUDs can be used in most women, including adolescents, those who have never been pregnant, and those who have previously had children. They do not affect breastfeeding and can be inserted immediately after delivery. They may also be used immediately after an abortion. Globally, 19.4% of women of reproductive age use intrauterine contraception according to 2019 data. The IUD has a more invasive insertion procedure than other birth control methods. Pain management for the insertion is evolving and practitioners may offer anything from NSAIDs and lidocaine to more complex arrangements like nitrous oxide or IV sedation. == Terminology == 1a20d74409 Though menstrual disorders were once considered more of a nuisance problem, they are now widely recognized as having a serious impact on society in the form of days lost from work brought about by the pain and suffering experienced by women. These disorders can arise from physiologic sources (pregnancy etc.), pathologic sources (stress, excessive exercise, weight loss, endocrine or structural abnormalities etc.), or iatrogenic sources (secondary to contraceptive use etc.). 1a20d74409

Cervical cap Margaret Sanger brought cervical caps to the U. in the 1910s, but later The cervical cap is a form of barrier contraception. S. These stem pessaries became precursors to the modern intrauterine device (IUD). A cervical cap fits over the cervix and blocks sperm from entering the uterus through the external orifice of the uterus, called the os 1a20d74409

Dysmenorrhea can occur without an underlying problem. Underlying issues that can cause dysmenorrhea include uterine fibroids, adenomyosis, and most commonly, endometriosis. It is more common among those with heavy periods, irregular periods, those whose periods started before twelve years of age and those who have a low body weight. A pelvic exam and ultrasound in individuals who are sexually active may be useful for diagnosis. Conditions that should be ruled out include ectopic pregnancy, pelvic inflammatory disease, interstitial cystitis and chronic pelvic pain.

Emergency contraceptive pills (ECPs), sometimes simply referred to as emergency contraceptives (ECs), or the morning-after pill, are medications intended to disrupt or delay ovulation or fertilization, which are necessary for pregnancy. 1a20d74409 The World Health Organization and United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention provide guidance on the safety of birth control methods among women with specific medical conditions. The most effective methods of birth control are sterilization by means of vasectomy in males and tubal ligation in females, intrauterine devices (IUDs), and implantable birth control. This is followed by a number of hormone-based methods including contraceptive pills, patches, vaginal rings, and injections. Less effective methods include physical barriers such as condoms, diaphragms and fertility awareness methods. Birth control While copper IUDs may increase menstrual bleeding and result in more painful cramps, hormonal IUDs may reduce menstrual bleeding or stop menstruation Birth control, also known as contraception, anticonception, and fertility control, is the use of methods or devices to prevent pregnancy. Some cultures limit or discourage access to birth control because they consider it to be morally, religiously, or politically undesirable. Planning, making available, and using human birth control is called family planning. Birth control has been used since ancient times, but effective and safe methods of birth control only became available in the 20th century 1a20d74409

The term cervical cap has been used to refer to a number of barrier contraceptives, including the Prentif, Dumas, Vimule, and Oves devices. In the United States, Prentif was the only brand available for several decades (Prentif was withdrawn from the U.S. market in 2005). During this time, it was common to use the term cervical cap to refer exclusively to the Prentif brand. 1a20d74409

Contraceptive implant of pregnancy. The implant may depend on the timed release of hormones to hinder ovulation or sperm development, the ability of copper to act as a natural spermicide within the uterus, or it may work using a non-hormonal, physical blocking mechanism. As with other contraceptives, a contraceptive implant is designed to prevent pregnancy, but it does not protect against sexually transmitted infections. Although they do have a higher risk of pregnancy compared to hormonal IUDs, failure rates with the copper IUD are still only approximately A contraceptive implant is an implantable medical device used for the purpose of birth control 1a20d74409

Emergency contraception is a birth control measure taken to reduce the risk of pregnancy following unprotected sexual intercourse or when other regular contraceptive measures have not worked properly or have not been used correctly. It is intended to be used occasionally and is not the same as medical abortion. Emergency contraception is offered to women who do not wish to conceive but have had unprotected sex on any day of the menstrual cycle, from day 21 after giving birth, or from day five after abortion or miscarriage. Emergency contraception measures include tablets taken... 1a20d74409 Options for menstrual suppression include hormonal medications like extended cycle combined hormonal... 1a20d74409 Side effects include irregular periods, benign ovarian cysts, pelvic pain, and depression. Rarely uterine perforation may occur. Use is not recommended during pregnancy but is safe with breastfeeding. The IUD with progestogen is a type of long-acting reversible birth control.
