Communication in... 897d2d6e93 Septicemic plague is mainly spread by infected fleas that live on small mammals, but can also result from handling infected mammals. It can develop either directly from exposure to *Y. pestis* or as a complication of untreated bubonic plague. In the case of primary infection, *Y. pestis* bacteria enter the skin after a flea bite and travel throughout the bloodstream, showing no localizing signs of infection. This makes diagnosis difficult, as plague is generally rare and initial symptoms resemble several other, more common... 897d2d6e93

Compared to humans, dogs possess a superior sense of smell and hearing, but inferior visual acuity. In the United States, they range primarily to the west of the Mississippi River, though they have also been introduced in a few eastern locales. Prairie dogs also have a mating call which consists of up to 25 barks Prairie dogs (genus *Cynomys*) are herbivorous burrowing ground squirrels native to the grasslands of North America. They are also found in the Canadian Prairies. In Mexico, prairie dogs are found primarily in the northern states, which lie at the southern end of the Great Plains: northeastern Sonora, north and northeastern Chihuahua, northern Coahuila, northern Nuevo León, and northern Tamaulipas 897d2d6e93

Genetic evidence indicates that fleas are a specialised lineage of parasitic scorpionflies (Mecoptera) sensu lato, most closely related to the family Nannochoristidae. The earliest known fleas lived in the Middle Jurassic; modern-looking forms appeared in the Cenozoic. Dogs were the first species to be domesticated over 14,000 years ago, before the development of agriculture, though genetic studies suggest the domestication process may have begun over 25,000 years ago. parasites are lice, fleas, fly larvae, ticks, mites, cestodes, nematodes, and coccidia. Dogs and the modern gray wolf share a common ancestor. Yersinia pestis transmission dynamics within prairie dogs do not follow the dynamics of blocked fleas; carcasses, unblocked fleas, or another vector could possibly be *Yersinia pestis* (*Y. Yersinia pestis* is responsible for the disease plague, which caused the Plague of Justinian and the Black Death, two of the deadliest pandemics in recorded history. Plague takes three main forms: pneumonic, septicemic, and bubonic. *pestis* is a hyperparasite. *pestis* is a facultative anaerobic parasitic bacterium that can infect humans primarily via its host, the oriental rat flea (*Xenopsylla cheopis*), but also through aerosols and airborne droplets for its pneumonic form. *pestis*; formerly *Pasteurella pestis*) is a gram-negative, non-motile, coccobacillus bacterium without spores. Trichodectes canis is a louse of the suborder Mallophaga, or chewing lice. *T. canis* is a small, flat-bodied louse. Males are typically smaller than females, with body lengths ranging from 1.60 to 1.68 mm in males and 1.75 to 1.82 mm in females. Females also differ from males in the fact that they possess a special organ that is located from underneath the end of the abdomen. This organ, when seen from above, resembles two bowed appendages on either side of the genital region. This organ serves two purposes – in helping to glue the eggs to hosts' fur, and to grasp fur in order to remain on the host. As a member... 897d2d6e93 Though *D. variabilis* may be exposed to *Borrelia burgdorferi*, the causative agent of Lyme disease, these ticks are not competent vectors for the transmission of this disease. The primary vectors for *B. burgdorferi* are the deer ticks *Ixodes scapularis* in eastern parts of the United States, *Ixodes pacificus* in California and Oregon, and *Ixodes ricinus* in Europe. *D. variabilis* may also carry *Anaplasma phagocytophilum*, the causative agent of human granulocytic anaplasmosis, and *Ehrlichia chaffeensis*, the causative agent of human monocytic ehrlichiosis. 897d2d6e93 The Greyhound's long legs, deep chest, flexible spine, and slim build enable high sprinting speeds. Y. pestis was discovered in 1894 by Alexandre Yersin, a Swiss/French physician and bacteriologist from the Pasteur Institute, during an epidemic of the plague in Hong Kong. Yersin was a member of the Pasteur school of thought. Kitasato Shibasaburō, a Japanese bacteriologist who practised Koch's methodology, was also engaged at the time in finding the causative agent of the plague. Septicemic plague However Septicemic plague is one of three types of plague caused by *Yersinia pestis*, a gram-negative species of bacterium. As the disease progresses, disseminated intravascular coagulation causes internal and external bleeding, gangrene, and shock. It is one of three forms of plague, along with bubonic (affecting the lymph nodes) and pneumonic (affecting the lungs) plagues. bites from infected fleas. Septicemic plague is a systemic disease in which *Y. pestis* rapidly infects the bloodstream, initially causing nonspecific symptoms including fever, chills, malaise, abdominal pain, diarrhea, and vomiting. These cats and dogs could then expose humans to the plague when the animal brings those infected fleas around people. Left untreated, septicemic plague is almost always fatal, sometimes within hours of initial symptoms 897d2d6e93

Flea Adult fleas grow to about 3 millimetres (1/8 inch) long, are usually dark in color, and have bodies that are "flattened" sideways or narrow, enabling them to move through their hosts' fur or feathers. Some species can leap 50 times their body length, a feat second only to jumps made by another group of insects, the superfamily of froghoppers. Fleas live by ingesting the blood of their hosts. Fleas live by ingesting the blood of their hosts. Flea larvae are worm-like, with no limbs; they have chewing mouthparts and feed on organic debris left on their hosts' skin. They lack wings; their hind legs are extremely well adapted for jumping. as external parasites of mammals and birds. Their claws keep them from being dislodged, and their mouthparts are adapted for piercing skin and sucking blood.
