

Two And Three Point Turns

This manoeuvre is a common requirement in driving tests. e3006385d2 Figure skating turns were first taught to new skaters learning to execute compulsory figures. After its demise in 1990, instead of replacing figures in training skaters, coaches continued to teach turns to instill "the discipline necessary to execute turns" during elements across all disciplines of figure skating (single skating, pair skating, and ice dance). Every figure skating turn is executed on both feet and in both the backward and forward directions. Every move, step, and element incorporates turns to connect steps, enter a spin or jump, and perform footwork. Turns can be executed in both directions.

The distance from the basket to the three-point line varies by competition level: in the National Basketball Association (NBA) the arc is 23 feet 9 inches (7.24 m) from the center of the basket; in the International Basketball Federation (FIBA), the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA), the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) (all divisions), and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), the arc is 6.75 m (22 ft 1.75 in) from the center of the basket; and in the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) the arc is 19 ft 9 in (6.02 m) from the center of the basket. Every three-point line becomes parallel to each sideline at the points where each arc is a specified distance from the sideline. Three-point turns are dangerous because they make the driver vulnerable to oncoming The three-point turn (sometimes called a Y-turn, K-turn, or broken U-turn) is the standard method of turning a vehicle around to face the opposite direction in a limited space, using forward and reverse gears. This is typically done when the road is too narrow for a U-turn, and there are no driveways or sideroads that are conducive to a two-point turn. Two-point conversion football, a two-point conversion, two-point convert, two-point try, or two-point attempt is a play a team attempts instead of kicking a one-point conversion In gridiron football, a two-point conversion, two-point convert, two-point try, or two-point attempt is a play a team attempts instead of kicking a one-point conversion immediately after it scores a touchdown. If the team fails, no additional points are earned. If the team succeeds, it earns two points in addition to the six points for the touchdown, for a total of eight points. In a two-point conversion attempt, the team that just scored must run a play from scrimmage close to the opponent's goal line and advance the ball across the goal line in the same manner as if it were scoring a touchdown e3006385d2

In the United States, U-turn regulations vary by state: in Indiana U-turns are allowed as long as the driver follows all of the precautions normally ascribed to making a left turn (yielding right-of-way, etc.). Many places, including Texas and Georgia, have specially designed U-turn lanes (referred to as Texas U-turn lanes). Such turns in ramps and trails may be A hairpin turn (also hairpin bend, hairpin curve, or hairpin corner) is a bend in a road with a very acute inner angle, making it necessary for a vehicle to turn about 180° to continue on the road. It is named for its resemblance to a bent metal hairpin. a vehicle to turn about 180° to continue on the road. Conversion attempts are untimed plays in American football, and in the Canadian game they are untimed in the final three minutes of each half. If any time remains in the half, the team that scored the touchdown proceeds to a kickoff after their conversion attempt. e3006385d2 The basic manoeuvre consists of driving across the road turning towards the offside kerb, reversing across the road to the original nearside kerb while turning, and driving forward towards the original offside kerb, now the nearside. In a narrow road or with a longer vehicle, more than three legs may be required to achieve a full 180 degree rotation. e3006385d2

U-turn In some areas, along with most intersections where so indicated, the maneuver is illegal, while in others, it is treated as a more ordinary turn, merely extended. It is called a "U-turn" because the maneuver looks like the letter U. ". Although U-turns are considered safer than two and three-point turns A U-turn in driving refers to performing a 180° rotation to reverse the direction of travel.

In still other areas, lanes are occasionally marked "U-turn permitted" or even "U-turn only. and drivers in the specified lane cannot continue forward ("U-turn only" lanes) e3006385d2

Hairpin turns are often used in order to decrease the steepness of the grade where a road climbs a steep slope, and are often arrayed in a zigzag pattern. Hairpin turns allow easier and safer ascents and descents of mountainous terrain than does a direct and steep climb and descent, although at the price of greater travel distances and usually lower speed limits because of the sharpness of the curves. Highways of this style are also generally less costly to build and maintain than highways with tunnels. e3006385d2

Three-point locking in single-point locking, the door on a cabinet locks only at the point where the key is turned, halfway up the edge of the door, three-point locking enables e3006385d2

Occasionally, on a divided highway, special U-turn ramps known as turnarounds exist to allow traffic to make a U-turn, though often their use is restricted to emergency and police vehicles only, and if used by passenger vehicles, are specifically limited by authorities to controlled slow-speed and flagger-directed turnarounds away from an incident or closure. e3006385d2

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
