Left untreated, pulpitis may become irreversible, then progress to pulp necrosis (death of the pulp) and apical periodontitis. Abscesses usually cause throbbing pain. Nicomachean Ethics No The Nicomachean Ethics (; Ancient Greek: Ἠθικὰ Νικομάχεια, *Ēthika Nikomacheia*) is Aristotle's best-known work on ethics: the science of the good for human life, that which is the goal or end at which all our actions aim. It consists of ten sections, referred to as books, and is closely related to Aristotle's *Eudemian Ethics*. The work is essential for the interpretation of Aristotelian ethics. The most common trigger is cold, with 75% of people with hypersensitivity reporting pain upon application of a cold stimulus. Other types of stimuli may also trigger pain in dentin hypersensitivity, including: 05c3b3726c Many emergencies exist and can range from bacterial, fungal, or viral infections to a fractured tooth or dental restoration, each requiring an individual response and treatment that is unique to the situation. Fractures (dental trauma) can occur anywhere on the tooth or to the surrounding bone, depending on the site and extent of the fracture the treatment options will vary. Dental restoration falling out or fracturing can also be considered a dental emergency as these can impact function in regards to aesthetics, eating and pronunciation and as such should be... 05c3b3726c A degree of dentin sensitivity is normal, but pain is not usually experienced in everyday activities like drinking a cooled drink. Therefore, although the terms dentin sensitivity and sensitive dentin are used interchangeably to refer to dental hypersensitivity, the latter term is the more accurate. 05c3b3726c

Bruxism Symptoms may be minimal, without patient awareness of the condition. Bruxism is a common behavior; the global prevalence of bruxism (both sleep and awake) is approximately 22%. It is an oral parafunctional activity; i. e. , it is unrelated to normal function such as eating or talking. Bruxism is thought to be one of the contributing factors in "meth mouth", a condition potentially associated with long Bruxism is excessive teeth grinding or jaw clenching. g. If nothing is done, after a while many teeth start wearing down until the entire tooth is gone. teeth and to prevent jaw pain. Several symptoms are commonly associated with bruxism, including aching jaw muscles, headaches, hypersensitive teeth, tooth wear, and damage to dental restorations (e. crowns and fillings) 05c3b3726c

Common causes include inflammation of the pulp (usually in response to tooth decay, dental trauma, or other factors), dentin hypersensitivity, apical periodontitis (inflammation of the periodontal ligament and alveolar bone around the root apex), dental abscesses (localized collections of pus), alveolar osteitis ("dry socket", a possible complication of tooth extraction), acute necrotizing ulcerative gingivitis (a gum infection), and temporomandibular disorder. 05c3b3726c

Human tooth As such, they are considered part of the human digestive system. [citation needed] When they do form Human teeth function to mechanically break down items of food by cutting and crushing them in preparation for swallowing and digesting. called "wisdom teeth" and usually emerge at ages 17 to 25. These molars may never erupt into the mouth or form at all. Teeth are made of multiple tissues of varying density and hardness. Humans have four types of teeth: incisors, canines, premolars, and molars, which each have a specific function. The incisors cut the food, the canines tear the food and the molars and premolars crush the food. The roots of teeth are embedded in the maxilla (upper jaw) or the mandible (lower jaw) and are covered by gums 05c3b3726c

Humans, like most other mammals, are diphyodont, meaning that they develop two sets of teeth. The first set, deciduous teeth, also called "primary teeth", "baby teeth", or "milk teeth", normally eventually contains 20 teeth. Primary teeth typically start to appear ("erupt") around six months of age and this may be distracting and/or painful for the infant. However, some babies are born with one or more visible teeth, known as neonatal teeth or "natal teeth". 05c3b3726c

Wisdom And wisdom can be viewed solely as wise behaviour, describing actions which lead to "an altruistic outcome by creatively and successfully solving problems. ". Wisdom can be viewed as a stable personality trait, but also as context-bound process, meaning that a person in some contexts behaves wisely, but in other contexts does not. Wisdom can also be viewed as influenced and determined by sociocultural norms and traditions. This nickname originated from Wisdom, also known as sapience, is defined by psychologists as a combination of "wit and virtue," the ability to apply expert tacit and experiential knowledge, balancing intrapersonal, interpersonal and institutional interests, to deal with complex questions of life and attain a common good. name for third molars, which are the last teeth to grow, is etymologically linked with wisdom, as in the English wisdom tooth 05c3b3726c

Impacted wisdom teeth This can be caused by a physical Impacted wisdom teeth is a condition where the third molars (wisdom teeth) are prevented from erupting into the mouth. This can be caused by a physical barrier, such as other teeth, or when the tooth is angled away from a vertical position. Prophylactic (preventative) extraction of wisdom teeth is preferred to be done at a younger age (middle to late teenage years) to take advantage of incomplete root development, which is associated with an easier surgical procedure and less

probability of complications. Removal of impacted wisdom teeth is advised for the future prevention of or in the current presence of certain pathologies, such as caries (dental decay), periodontal disease or cysts. Completely unerupted wisdom teeth usually result in no symptoms, although they can sometimes develop cysts or neoplasms. Impacted wisdom teeth is a condition where the third molars (wisdom teeth) are prevented from erupting into the mouth. Partially erupted wisdom teeth or wisdom teeth that are not erupted but are exposed to oral bacteria through deep periodontal pocket, can develop cavities or pericoronitis. However, in recent decades the preventive removal of impacted wisdom teeth has come into question, and some health organizations have issued guidelines calling to only remove impacted wisdom teeth in the case of

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Dental emergency Depending on the type of pain experienced an experienced clinician can determine the likely cause and can treat the issue as each tissue type gives different messages in a dental emergency. Pain can originate from the tooth, surrounding tissues or can have the sensation of originating in the teeth but be caused by an independent source (orofacial pain and toothache). Dental emergencies do not always involve pain, although A dental emergency is an issue involving the teeth and supporting tissues that are of high importance to be treated by the relevant professional. the teeth and supporting tissues that are of high importance to be treated by the relevant professional. Dental emergencies do not always involve pain, although this is a common signal that something needs to be looked at

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Tooth eruption permanent third molars (also called "wisdom teeth") also erupt. Then, the remaining permanent teeth erupt into the mouth during the permanent dentition stage. The first human teeth to appear, the deciduous (primary) teeth (also known as baby or milk teeth), erupt into the mouth from around 6 months until 2 years of age, in a process known as "teething". It is currently believed that the periodontal ligament plays an important role in tooth eruption. At that time, the first permanent tooth erupts and begins a period in which there is a combination of primary and permanent teeth, known as the mixed dentition stage, which lasts until the last primary tooth is lost. These are sometimes extracted because of decay, pain or impactions. These teeth are the only ones in the mouth until a person is about 6 years old, creating the primary dentition stage. The main reasons for Tooth eruption is a process in tooth development in which the teeth enter the mouth and become visible

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The causes of bruxism are not completely understood, but probably involve multiple factors. Awake bruxism is more common in women, whereas men and women are affected in equal proportions by sleep bruxism...

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Dental extraction Sometimes impacted wisdom teeth (wisdom teeth that are stuck and unable to grow normally into the mouth) cause A dental extraction (also referred to as tooth extraction, exodontia, exodontics, or informally, tooth pulling) is the removal of teeth from the dental alveolus (socket) in the alveolar bone. especially when they are associated with toothache. Sometimes impacted wisdom teeth (wisdom teeth that are stuck and unable to grow normally into the mouth) cause recurrent infections of the gum (pericoronitis), and may be removed when other conservative treatments have failed (cleaning, antibiotics and operculectomy). In orthodontics, if the teeth are crowded, healthy teeth may be extracted (often bicuspids) to create space so the rest of the teeth can be straightened. Extractions are performed for a wide variety of reasons, but most commonly to remove teeth which have become unrestorable through tooth decay, periodontal disease, or dental trauma, especially when they are associated with toothache

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There are two main types of bruxism: one occurs during sleep (nocturnal

bruxism) and one during wakefulness (awake bruxism). Dental damage may be similar in both types, but the symptoms of sleep bruxism tend to be worse on waking and improve during the course of the day, and the symptoms of awake bruxism may not be present at all on waking, and then worsen over the day. 05c3b3726c Although researchers agree that tooth eruption is a complex process, there is little agreement on the identity of the mechanism that controls eruption. There have been many theories over time that have been eventually disproven. According to Growth Displacement Theory, the tooth is pushed upward into the mouth by the growth of the tooth's root in opposite... 05c3b3726c Extractions could be categorized into non-surgical (simple) and surgical, depending on the type of tooth to be removed and other factors. 05c3b3726c

Dentin hypersensitivity Dentin hypersensitivity (DH, DHS) is dental pain which is sharp in character and of short duration, arising from exposed dentin surfaces in response to stimuli, typically thermal, evaporative, tactile, osmotic, chemical or electrical; and which cannot be ascribed to any other dental disease 05c3b3726c
