As a result of British atomic tests at Emu Field in 1953, a weather station was needed to the far north-west of the test sites, to determine when suitable weather conditions existed for future tests. Len Beadell was given the task of selecting a team and constructing access roads from the test locality to the future weather station. The weather station was named Giles, after the explorer Ernest Giles who had explored that part of the remote inland. Tail risk Prudent asset managers are typically cautious with the tail involving losses which could damage or ruin portfolios, and not the beneficial tail of outsized gains. However, as investors are generally more concerned with unexpected losses rather than gains, the debate about tail risk is focused on the left tail. Tail risks include low-probability events arising at both ends of a normal distribution curve, also known as tail events. market returns follow a normal distribution, characterized by the bell curve, which illustrates that, given enough observations, all values in a sample Tail risk, sometimes called "fat tail risk", is the financial risk of an asset or portfolio of assets moving more than three standard deviations from its current price, above the risk of a normal distribution

Early warning systems are principally designed to identify a deteriorating patient earlier, allowing for early interventions and the prevention of adverse outcomes. EWS scores give a standardised classification to the degree of physiological abnormality, with higher scores representing a higher risk of deterioration. Anomaly detection finds application in many domains including cybersecurity, medicine, machine vision, statistics,

neuroscience, law enforcement and financial fraud to name only a few. Anomalies were initially searched for clear rejection or omission from the data to aid statistical analysis, for example to compute the mean or standard deviation. They were also removed to better predictions from models such as linear regression, and more recently their removal aids the performance of machine learning algorithms. However, in many applications anomalies themselves are of interest and are the observations most desirous in the entire data set, which need to be identified and separated from noise or irrelevant outliers. 1f41ffaddf The first recorded EWS was developed by a team in James Paget University Hospital, Norfolk, United Kingdom, and presented at the May 1997 conference of the Intensive Care Society. 1f41ffaddf

The most common clinical signs present in a tooth with a necrosed pulp would be a grey discoloration of the crown and/or periapical radiolucency. == History == 1f41ffaddf Tail risk is sometimes defined less strictly: as merely the risk (or probability) of rare events. The arbitrary definition of the tail region as beyond three standard deviations may also be broadened, such as the SKEW index which uses the larger tail region starting at two standard deviations. 1f41ffaddf Tests for a necrotic pulp include: vitality testing using a thermal test or an electric pulp tester. Discolouration may be visually obvious, or more subtle. 1f41ffaddf Treatment usually involves endodontics or extraction. 1f41ffaddf The standard deviation of a random variable, sample, statistical population, data set or probability distribution is the square root of its variance (the variance being the average of the squared deviations from the mean). A useful property of the standard deviation is that, unlike the variance, it is expressed in the same unit as the data.
