== Background == The film had its world premiere in the main competition of the 75th Venice International Film Festival on September 3, 2018, where Dafoe won the Volpi Cup for Best Actor. It was theatrically released in the United States on November 16, 2018, by CBS Films, before streaming on Netflix in France on February 15, 2019. It is one of thirteen double-square canvases of landscapes around Auvers completed by van Gogh between 17 June and 27 July. The depiction of the rain with dark, diagonal lines is considered to be inspired by Japanese art, specifically the woodcuts of Hiroshige. It also displays the visceral relationship between nature and emotion that is a trademark of van Gogh's later work, as well as the stylistic innovations of a raised horizon line, expressive brushstrokes, and bold colours. This was one of Van Gogh's last paintings before his death and has been interpreted as symbolizing the cycle of human suffering contrasted with a sense of hope. The painting was bought by Gwendoline Davies in 1920 in Paris, and was donated to the National Museum of Wales in Cardiff as part of her bequest in 1952. 96a73393c5

Health of Vincent van Gogh His death in 1890 is generally accepted to have been a suicide: infection from a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the chest. Van Gogh suffered from some seizures or crises,

and in one of these attacks, on 23 December 1888, he cut off a part, or possibly all, of his left ear. There is no consensus on the state of Vincent van Gogh's physical and mental health, with many competing hypotheses advanced as to possible medical conditions that he may have had. These include epilepsy, bipolar disorder, borderline personality disorder, sunstroke, acute intermittent porphyria, lead poisoning, Ménière's disease, schizophrenia, schizoaffective disorder, substance use disorder, non-suicidal self-injury disorder ("self-harm"), and a possible generalized anxiety disorder.

Vincent van Gogh diagonally cut removed the lobe and probably a little more. The policeman and Rey both claimed van Gogh severed the entire outer ear; Rey repeated his account. Vincent Willem van Gogh (Dutch: ['vɪnsɛnt 'vɪləŋ vɑŋ 'ɣɔx] ; 30 March 1853 – 29 July 1890) was a Dutch Post-Impressionist painter who is among the most famous and influential figures in the history of Western art. His suicide at age 37 followed years of mental illness and poverty. In just over a decade he created about 2,100 artworks, including around 860 oil paintings, most of them in the last two years of his life. They include landscapes, still lifes, portraits and self-portraits, and are characterised by bold colours and dramatic, impulsive and expressive brushwork that contributed to the foundations of modern art.

The painting is amongst the very first paintings by van Gogh. Although he had been drawing for many years and occasionally applied watercolor washes, he did not take up painting properly until his study visit to his cousin-in-law and mentor Anton Mauve at The Hague in December 1881. *Dreams* addresses themes such as childhood, spirituality, art, death, and mistakes and transgressions made by humans against nature. At the end of August 1881, van Gogh visited his cousin-in-law Anton Mauve, a noted and successful painter and a leading member of the Hague School, and showed him some studies...

His fame reached its first peak in Austria and Germany before World War I (influencing a whole generation of German artists) and at the end of the war in Switzerland. Due to the economic crisis in Germany and France after 1918, pioneer collections of Impressionist and Post-Impressionist art, which included works by Van Gogh, were dissolved. This gave British and American collectors

(private as well as public) the opportunity to acquire first-rate works. The American novelist Irving Stone published a fictionalized account of Van... 96a73393c5

Gauguin was born in Paris in 1848, amidst the tumult of Europe's revolutionary year. Initially working as a stockbroker, Gauguin started painting in his spare time, his interest in art kindled by visits to galleries and exhibitions. The financial crisis of 1882 significantly impacted his brokerage career, prompting a shift to full-time painting. Self-portrait The genre is venerable, but not until the Renaissance, with increased wealth and interest in the individual as a subject, did it become truly popular. With better and cheaper mirrors, and the advent of the panel portrait, many painters, sculptors and printmakers tried some form of self-portraiture. Although self-portraits have been made since the earliest times, it is not until the mid-15th century that artists can be frequently identified depicting themselves, as either the main subject or important characters in their work. Portrait of a Man in a Turban by Jan van Eyck of 1433 may well be the earliest known panel self-portrait. Besides Diego Velázquez, (in his painting Las Meninas), Rembrandt Van Rijn, Jan de Bray, Gustave Courbet, Vincent van Gogh, and Paul Gauguin other artists Self-portraits are portraits artists make of themselves. He painted a separate portrait of his wife, and he belonged to the social group that had begun to commission portraits, already more common among wealthy Netherlanders than south of the Alps.

Born into an upper-middle-class family in Zundert, Van Gogh drew as a child and was serious, quiet and thoughtful. As a young man he worked as an art dealer, often travelling, but became depressed

after he was transferred to London. He turned to religion, and spent time as a Protestant missionary in southern Belgium. He drifted in ill health and solitude before taking up painting in 1881, having moved back home with his parents.
