

Icd Code For Hypertension

These historical terms are considered misleading, as hypertension is never benign. Consequently, the terms have fallen out of use (see history of hypertension). The terminology persisted in the International Classification of Disease (ICD9), but is not included in the ICD10 as of 2014. In the ICD-9 system, a disease may have a cause listed in one chapter, and its manifestations listed in another. For example, Tuberculous meningitis is caused by a bacterial infection, and is therefore listed in Chapter 1, Infectious and parasitic diseases. However, as it results in a disorder of the nervous system, it is also listed in this chapter. An asterisk (*) means that a disease has an underlying cause which can be found elsewhere in the ICD. A code referring to such an underlying cause may be right next to the name, in parentheses, and marked with a dagger symbol of the Times New Roman font (†).

ICD coding for rare diseases However, more than 5400 rare diseases are included in ICD-11 and can be recorded using an ICD-11 URI. Of the approximately 7,000 rare diseases, only about 500 have a specific code. It is important for health insurance reimbursement, administration, epidemiology, and research.
