== Medical uses == dc01925661 Arthropod vectors are thought to be the primary source of infection, although *M. haemofelis* is also known to be transmitted from queen to kitten and following blood transfusion. Leptospirosis Bleeding from the lungs associated with leptospirosis is known as severe pulmonary haemorrhage syndrome. Signs and symptoms can range from none to mild (headaches, muscle pains, and fevers) to severe (bleeding in the lungs or meningitis). Weil's disease (VILES), the acute, severe form of leptospirosis, causes the infected individual to become jaundiced (skin and eyes become yellow), develop kidney failure, and bleed. The antibiotic doxycycline is effective in preventing leptospirosis infection. Lyme disease Infection is treatable with antibiotics. Infections are most common in the spring and early summer. If an infection develops, several antibiotics are effective, including doxycycline, amoxicillin and Lyme disease, also known as Lyme borreliosis, is a tick-borne disease caused by species of *Borrelia* bacteria, transmitted by blood-feeding ticks in the genus *Ixodes*. possibly testing for specific antibodies in the blood. The most common sign of infection is an expanding red rash, known as erythema migrans (EM), which appears at the site of the tick bite about a week afterwards. The rash is typically neither itchy nor painful. Approximately 70-80% of infected people develop a rash. Other early symptoms may include fever, headaches and tiredness. If untreated, symptoms may include loss of the ability to move one or both sides of the face, joint pains, severe headaches with neck stiffness or heart palpitations. Months to years later, repeated episodes of joint pain and swelling may occur. 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== Course of infection == dc01925661 The bacteria causing this disease, Brucella, are small, Gram-negative, nonmotile, nonspore-forming, rod-shaped (coccobacilli) bacteria. They function as facultative intracellular parasites, causing chronic disease, which usually persists for life. Four species infect humans: B. abortus, B. canis, B. melitensis, and B. suis. B. abortus is less virulent than B. melitensis and is primarily a disease of cattle. B. canis affects dogs. B. melitensis is the most virulent and invasive species; it usually infects goats and occasionally sheep. B. suis is of intermediate virulence and chiefly infects pigs. Symptoms include profuse sweating and joint and muscle pain. Brucellosis has been recognized in animals and humans since the early 20th century. dc01925661

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
