Cradle cap most commonly begins sometime in the first three months but can occur in later years. Similar symptoms in older children are more likely to be dandruff than cradle cap. The rash is often prominent around the ear, the eyebrows or the eyelids. It may appear in other locations as well, where it is called infantile seborrheic dermatitis. Cradle cap is just a special—and more benign—case of this condition. The exact cause of cradle cap is not known. Cradle cap is not spread from person to person (not contagious). It is also not caused by poor hygiene. It is not an allergy, and it is not dangerous. Cradle cap often lasts a few months. In some children, the condition can last until age 2 or 3. == Types ==

Food fortification The addition of micronutrients to staples and condiments can prevent large-scale deficiency diseases in these cases. Food manufacturers and governments have used these practices since the 1920s to help prevent nutrient deficiencies in populations. Food enrichment specifically means adding back nutrients lost during food processing, while fortification includes adding nutrients not naturally present. significant number of NTDs in infants. Two common types of NTDs, spina bifida and anencephaly, affect approximately 2500-3000 infants born in the US annually Food fortification is the addition of micronutrients (essential trace elements and vitamins) to food products. Common nutrient deficiencies in a region often result from local soil conditions or limitations of staple foods
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Some metals are toxic when they form poisonous soluble compounds which interfere with enzyme systems, such as superoxide dismutase, catalase, or glutathione peroxidase. Only soluble metal-containing compounds are toxic by forming coordination complexes, which consist of a metal ion surrounded by ligands. Ligands can range from water in metal aquo complexes to alkyl groups, as in tetraethyl lead. ff2da96ac5

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Zinc Zinc deficiency Zinc is a chemical element; it has symbol Zn and atomic number 30. Zinc is refined industrially by froth flotation of the ore, roasting, and final extraction using electricity (electrowinning). It is the first element in group 12 (IIB) of the periodic table. The largest concentration of economically feasible lodes in descending order are located in China, Peru, and Australia, among others. In some respects, zinc is chemically similar to magnesium: both elements exhibit only one normal oxidation state (+2), and the Zn^{2+} and Mg^{2+} ions are of similar size. It is a slightly brittle metal at room temperature and has a shiny blue whitish appearance when surface oxidation is removed. Zinc is the 24th most abundant element in Earth's crust, with an average concentration of 70 grams per ton. Zinc also has five stable isotopes; the most abundant of which, Zn-64, comprises nearly half of zinc's total abundance. The most common zinc ore is sphalerite (zinc blende), a zinc sulfide mineral. treatment for acrodermatitis enteropathica, a genetic disorder affecting zinc absorption that was previously fatal to affected infants
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Food fortification has been identified as the second strategy of four by the WHO and FAO to begin decreasing the incidence of nutrient deficiencies at the global level. As outlined by the FAO, the most commonly fortified foods are cereals and cereal-based products; milk and dairy products; fats and oils; accessory food items; tea and other beverages; and infant formulas. Undernutrition and nutrient deficiency is estimated globally to cause the deaths of between 3 and 5 million people per year. Ivar Bang first described the DBS as an unusual sampling method in 1913. The concept that capillary blood, obtained from pricking the heel or finger and blotted onto filter paper, could be used to screen for metabolic diseases in large populations of neonates was introduced in Scotland by Robert Guthrie in 1963. Neonatal screening for phenylketonuria became nationwide in 1969–70. Since then, Guthrie card samples have been collected routinely from infants in over 20 countries to screen for phenylketonuria and more recently for congenital hypothyroidism, sickle cell disorders and HIV infection. The limitations of sensitivity and specificity when screening such small volumes of blood restricted the use of dried blood spots for many years. However, recent advances such as the production of monoclonal antibodies, expression of synthetic proteins, and the introduction of the polymerase chain reaction...

The other main type is otitis media with effusion (OME), typically not associated with symptoms, although occasionally a feeling of fullness is described; it is defined as the presence of non-infectious fluid in the middle ear which may persist for weeks or months often after an episode of acute otitis media. Chronic suppurative otitis media (CSOM) is middle ear inflammation that results in a perforated tympanic membrane with discharge from the ear for more than six weeks. It may be a complication of acute otitis media. Pain is rarely present. Exposure to metals, primarily due to occupational exposure or environmental pollution, can increase metal concentration into hazardous range.
