Organic personality disorder It is characterized by a significant personality change featuring abnormal behavior due to an underlying traumatic brain injury or another pathophysiological medical condition affecting the brain. Controversy erupted when psychiatrists in 1970, who had not spoken to any of the patients, called the outbreak a case of "mass hysteria". 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ICD-11 The ICD-11 is the eleventh revision of the International Classification of Diseases (ICD). Development of the ICD-11 started in 2007 and spanned over a decade of work, involving over 300 specialists from 55 countries divided into 30 work groups, with an additional 10,000 proposals from people all over the world. Following an alpha version in May 2011 and a beta draft in May 2012, a stable version of the ICD-11 was released on 18 June 2018, and officially endorsed by all WHO members during the 72nd World Health Assembly on 28 May 2019. The ICD is developed and annually updated by the World Health Organization (WHO). It replaces the ICD-10 as the global standard for recording health information and causes of death. The ICD-11 is a large ontology consisting of about 85,000 entities, also called classes or nodes. An entity can be anything that is relevant to health care. It usually represents a disease or a pathogen, but it can also be an isolated symptom or (developmental) anomaly of the body. There are also classes for reasons for contact with health services, social circumstances of the patient, and external causes of injury or death. The ICD-11 is part of the WHO-FIC, a family of medical... d331b21516 Chapter 5 of the ICD-9, which was first published in 1977, was used in the field of psychiatry for approximately three and a half decades. In the United States, an extended version of the ICD-9 was developed called the ICD-9-CM. Several editions of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, or the DSM, interfaced with the codes of the ICD-9-CM. Following the DSM-II (1968), which used the ICD-8, the ICD-9-CM was used by the DSM-III (1980), the DSM-III-R (1987), the DSM-IV (1994), and the DSM-IV-TR (2000). The DSM-5 (2013), the current version, also features ICD-9-CM codes, listing them alongside the codes of Chapter V of the ICD-10-CM. There is no laboratory test for the disorder, but blood testing and similar may be done to rule out physical conditions that can cause similar symptoms. The most common time of onset is in a person's 20s. Men are much less likely to report than women, with approximately 33.2% of men and 43.0% of women with depressive symptoms reporting seeking help, possibly due to pressures of masking for men. Adjustment disorder mixed depression and anxiety, disturbance of conduct, mixed disturbance of emotions and conduct, and unspecified. The maladaptive response usually involves otherwise normal emotional and behavioral reactions that manifest more intensely than usual (considering contextual and cultural factors), causing marked distress, preoccupation with the stressor and its consequences, and functional impairment. In the early 19th century, the diagnosis of neuresthenia ('nerve weakness'), which had overlaps with current ME/CFS criteria, was popular. Various outbreaks of similar enigmatic disease occurred in the early 20th century, variably known as atypical poliomyelitis, Akureyri disease, or epidemic neuromyasthenia. d331b21516

Occupational burnout is classified as an occupational phenomenon but is not recognized by the WHO as a medical or psychiatric condition. Social psychologist Christina Maslach and colleagues made clear that burnout does not constitute "a single, one-dimensional phenomenon." However, national health bodies in some European countries do recognize it as such, and it is also independently recognized by some health practitioners.
