The track "Scars of the Crucifix" spawned Deicide's first ever music video, filmed in Nottingham. The closing track, "The Pentecostal", is followed by a hidden untitled bonus track with drummer/composer Steve Asheim playing a classical piano solo. The song "Fuck Your God" was part of a playlist used as a method of torture on Iraqi detainees by being piped into their bunks to induce sleep deprivation. e6a5db541b

A limited edition of this album included a 3" bonus CD; the vinyl release included a bonus 7" containing the same material. The 2007 re-release came as part of Earache's Classic Metal series with The DVD as bonus disc. In 2012, Earache Records released a remastered edition on limited edition coloured vinyl and CD digipak. They have released eight albums and one EP, and have twice been nominated for Grammy awards.

Rival Sons They are signed to Atlantic Records via Dave Cobb's label Low Country Sound, an imprint of Elektra.
