Cuetzalan Cuetzalan was named a "Pueblo Mágico" in 2002. as the municipal seat for the surrounding municipality of Cuetzalan del Progreso. The town gets its name from the Nahuatl word "xonotl," which means jonote (*Heliocarpus appendiculatus*), and "-tla," which means abundant, which together means "where the jonote is abundant." The town was called "Xonotla" by the people because there are many trees whose oil was used to cure ailments. The place was named by Ixocélotl whose name means "jaguar face."

Yohualican and the larger nearby city of El Tajín both reached a cultural and political epoch during the Classic period and are both believed to have been constructed and populated by the Totonac people. Puebla The origins of the state lie in the city of Puebla, which was founded by the Spanish in this valley in 1531 to secure the trade route between Mexico City and the port of Veracruz.
