ADHD was previously thought to be a childhood disorder that improved with age, but later research challenged this theory. This was implemented to add flexibility in the diagnosis of adults. This represents a change from the DSM-IV, which required symptom onset before the age of 7

With differing rates of diagnosis across countries, states within countries, races, and ethnicities, some suspect factors other than the presence of the symptoms of ADHD are playing a role in diagnosis, although the prevalence of ADHD is consistent internationally. Some sociologists consider ADHD to be an example of the medicalization of deviant behavior, that is, turning the previously non-medical issue of school performance... Many historical figures were much later speculated of having ADHD. Some, such as Matthew Smith, argue that even though it is possible to observe hyperactivity symptoms on those people, it is wrong to diagnose them with ADHD, as it is a modern construct and hyperactivity was not seen as a disorder. In 1980, the DSM-III included "ADD (attention-deficit disorder) with or without hyperactivity". In 1987 this label was refined to "ADHD (attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder)" in the DSM-III-R, and further refined to "ADHD (attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder)" in the 1994 DSM-IV. 1ceae1b229
